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What IS iMe?

iMe is an application that is about... you! The purpose of iMe is to gather all your important data (wether that data is images, sounds, notes, passwords, etc) into an application. It will also allow you to backup this data using your WiFi connection.

What iMe is NOT?

iMe is not an organizer. Although it has support for toDo's, (and later it will have support for notifications with toDos) it is not intended to be an organizer.

How safe is iMe?

Although the original version of iMe was originally designed to implement an advanced encryption algorithm, legal reasons forced me to remove that encryption. iMe will store your application's data securely into a custom designed database, which is already hard to read data through. A person that is trying to search your iPhone and see your personal data will not be able to do that without your personal password, even if iMe does not use encryption.

But, times are hard. If your application is stolen, then there is no guarantee that your iPhone won't fall into the hands of a very talented cracker. However, that applies for all applications out there! The weakness of any computer system is the human factor. There is no impenetrable system. That's why I am struggling to get that Licence that will allow me to implement encryption in iMe once again.

However, don't worry. No one will be able to view your personal data as long as you don't allow someone to see the contents of your iPhone's HD, using Cydia. Even if you do, you must fall into someone who really knows his job.

I am not pleased. I want more safety

Beta versions of iMe already some encryption algorithms, making it harder

for crackers to see your app. With each update, iMe is becoming stronger and safer.

How do I enable Thumbnails?

Because of the reason that thumbnail support was added at a later stage, you must enable them by hand. Go into the "Settings" pane of the iPhone, and find the "iMe" subcategory. Inside that subcategory, you will find the "Image Thumbnails" option. Set it to on, and iMe will have its thumbnails enabled.
